### Leadership Team



Dear Parents and Carers,

I have to apologise for the late publication of this newsletter. We have had a lot of illness in the teaching and leadership teams, coupled with a very busy start to the term, that impacted our ability to get this communication out as per the usual schedule.

The term started out with dance lessons for all students in years four to six, facilitated by Mitzi from Melbourne Djembe. Year six students then had two excursions: firstly they visited the SIEV X Memorial on the lakeshore of Weston Park, as a powerful provocation for their next unit of inquiry, and then they attended a musical performance as guests of St. Claire's School. The week culminated with a P&C "Olympic' Trivia Night which was great fun to attend.

The following week we held our athletics carnival at the Woden athletics field. The initial morning iciness was short lived and we had a wonderful day outdoors. Students gave all the events their best efforts, encouraged on by many parents, staff and eighteen Telopea Park High School volunteers. We have fifty five students going on to the next stage of ACT Athletics at the Southside carnival on August 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Last week most of our year four students spent two nights and three days at Birrigai, participating in outdoor education activities and a bush walk. Camp was a new experience which the students approached positively, despite some having a degree of trepidation at the outset. Deb Lawrence and I shared supporting the teachers at camp and witnessed the highlights first hand. We were proud of the students' 'can do' attitudes, their encouragement of peers and their respectful manner towards Birrigai and school staff, even at the end when everyone was incredibly tired. The Birrigai staff were exceptionally well organised, were flexible in meeting individual student needs and delivered great learning experiences.

On behalf of the school I have many thanks to give:

- Heidi Norton and Leigh Kanara for the many, many hours of work they put in to organising the athletics carnival and year four camp

- The year four teaching team and assistant educators who were on call twenty four hours a day at camp
- The wonderful parent volunteers who drove out to Birrigai and helped us each day (including two parents
  who stayed overnight). Their presence made student support at camp so much easier and was greatly
  appreciated by the teachers.

Things haven't quietened down at all. This coming week is Photo Week – don't forget to send your payment and order forms to school with your children on their scheduled photo day/s and make sure they are in full school uniform.

If accessing school uniform is difficult for financial or other reasons please contact the front office so that we can assist. No child should go without what they need for school, whether this be uniform, stationary, participation in excursions or even lunch. We have student support funds to help families in difficult times so please reach out if you need help.

To celebrate all things reading and books, we have special events organised for the next two weeks. Book Fair kicks off today in the library and runs for Weeks 4 and 5. Ms. Naidoo has developed a schedule for classes to visit Book Fair and students can write a wish list during this visit. Families are also invited to browse Book Fair before and after school. We will celebrate with our annual Book Week Parade, Walkathon and Grandparent Morning Tea on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> August. Children are encouraged to dress up as their favourite character on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> August to participate in the Walkathon and Book Week Parade.

#### **WELLBEING**

As I am sure you are already aware we experienced a very contagious gastroenteritis outbreak recently. By paying attention to good hand hygiene and keeping students and staff at home whilst unwell, the spread of the infection has slowed down dramatically. However we are not out of the woods yet, and there are other respiratory viruses in our community. ACT Health has updated their advice that students and staff should say home for **48 hours** after gastro symptoms have stopped. The <u>ACT Health Fact Sheet – Viral Gastroenteritis</u> outlines the symptoms, treatment options, and exclusion from school periods.

They have also reminded us that, in line with the ACT Public Health Regulations, parents are required to notify the school if their child has a confirmed case of any infectious disease, or if there are reasonable grounds for believing that their child has an infectious disease.

For each child in their family who attends an ACT public school, parents and carers will receive:

- A letter about the student survey outlining the reasons for collection and privacy provision for the data; and
- An email about the **parent survey**, including a unique link to access the survey. **Genuine survey invitation** emails will have the title "The 2024 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey is now open!" and will be sent from EDU Surveys & Evaluation with 'from' address <a href="mailto:EDUSurveys@act.gov.au">EDUSurveys@act.gov.au</a>.

If you do not receive the survey invitation, please check your Junk email folder; if it is not there, please contact the Front Office. The Survey will be available online in other languages: Arabic, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Urdu, Vietnamese, Punjabi, Bengali, Spanish, Telugu, French and Italian. Respondents can select their preferred language when they start the survey. A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon. These surveys are available at the Front Office.

For the results to reflect the opinions of our whole school community, we need as many parents and carers, staff and students as possible to complete the survey. Your feedback is important, and we hope you will take part.

It is a cashless online ordering system which streamlines payment, ordering and processing of purchases and events. Quick and easy, it can be accessed 24/7 on PC, Mac, or mobile app.

School uniform orders for existing students will be delivered to your child's classroom. Otherwise, orders can be collected from the front office.

With COVID continuing to present a risk we prefer that orders are made online where possible.

Secondhand requests can be emailed through to the shop manager.

Donations can be placed in the purple bin in the front office foyer.

Lost property collected around the school is placed in the big blue bin outside of the uniform shop.

Due to the amount of lost property and the shortage of staff, labeled items will no longer be returned to classrooms. The groups are active performance ensembles, and the families of students auditioning need to be prepared to make a strong commitment to rehearsal and performance attendance for the full year.

\*Please note that the ACT IMP Chorale (formerly known as the ACT IMP Senior Concert Choir) will be un-auditioned in 2025. Further information about the application process for this ensemble will be made available in Term 4.

Audition registration is **now open** for the following ensembles:

- Junior Concert Band experienced woodwind, brass and percussion players in Years 7 & 8 in ACT government schools in 2025
- Senior Concert Band experienced woodwind, brass, percussion and electric bass players in Years 9-12 in ACT government schools in 2025
- **Jazz Band** experienced saxophone, trumpet, trombone, electric guitar, bass, drum kit, keyboard and vibraphone players in Years 9-12 in ACT government schools in 2025
- **Percussion Ensemble** experienced percussionists (tuned and untuned instruments) in Years 7-12 in ACT government schools in 2025

Please note that an ability to read music notation is required for all of the above ensembles.

Students are welcome to audition for one or more ensembles. Membership in each ensemble is considered separately.

Audition registration closes Monday 14 October 2024. This is a strict deadline.
