Leadership Team Overview



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to week 7, and a new season, although the weather of late has definitely not been autumnal. This term has already shaped up to be a busy one with so much happening.

Australian Curriculum V9.0 and the PYP

One of my many roles and my great passion is coordinating the program of inquiry (POI) for our Red Hill PYP community. I believe that it is important for me to keep you abreast of our commitment to the IB and changes to the program that may have an impact on our learning community. I would like to share some exiting news from the IB PYP newsletter (published March 2024) that confirms the rigour of the Primary Years Program (PYP),

"The Primary Years Programme and Middle-Years Programme (MYP)have been recognized by the Australia Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) to meet the principles outlined in the Australian Curriculum, highlighting how IB´s framework empowers students to become confident and creative individuals, successful learners, and active and informed community members.

This recognition in August stemmed from IB's submission of an application earlier this year, seeking to assess the compatibility of the PYP and MYP with the latest iteration of the Australian Curriculum, Version 9.0. The review conducted by the ACARA Recognition Committee declared that IB programmes enable students to attain equivalent learning outcomes in various key subjects, including English, Mathematics, Science and Humanities and Social Sciences, Health and Physical Education, Languages, Technologies and The Arts by the end of year 10.

The ACARA Alternative Curriculum Framework Recognition Process seeks to determine the extent to which a well-established alternative national curriculum framework can deliver educational outcomes for students comparable with those based on the Australian curriculum. Moreover, the process considered the extent to which the IB framework aligns with the guidelines defined in the Alice Springs (Mparntwe) Education Declaration, which sets out a vision for a world-class education system that encourages and supports every student, no matter where they live or what kind of challenges they face.

Olli-Pekka Heinonen, Director General at the IB affirmed, "We are immensely proud of the recognition bestowed upon the PYP and MYP by ACARA. This acknowledgement underscores the unwavering commitment of the IB to provide a world-class education that aligns seamlessly with the Australian Curriculum. Our mission has always been to nurture well-rounded, inquisitive, and confident individuals, and this recognition reaffirms our dedication

to empowering students to excel in a rapidly changing global landscape. We look forward to continuing our partnership with educators, schools, and students across Australia to provide the best opportunities for the youth."

This is an important recognition for the IB and for all of us in the learning community, in knowing that your children and our students are receiving a world-class education because of the IB/PYP. If you are unsure what an IB education offers your child and missed this at the recent parent evening, please feel free to send me an email though the front office, and I will send you some information.

Toddle Portfolio

Thank you so much to everyone who has quickly returned your child's third party permission note so that they can have access to devices and applications to share their learning with you. We are trialling a new application this year which is called *Toddle Portfolio*. It is very similar to the SEESAW application that we have used in the past. You will receive an invitation via your class teacher to sign up and download the Toddle app if your child/ren is in grades 1-4 and grade 6. You will then have access to your child's digital portfolio. Student Portfolio on Toddle is a powerful way for families to gain an authentic insight into their child's learning journey, effortlessly navigating through portfolio entries, and engaging with these posts. Swimming Carnival

I would like to extend my congratulations for a successful swimming carnival that was held last Friday. It was a hot day but an enjoyable one for all who attended. A big thank you goes to Ms. Heidi Norton and Mr Dan Graetz for their organisation and to all staff who attended the carnival. We thank everyone for their respectful and principled behaviour while at the pool and hope that the many pieces of clothing that were left at the pool are claimed by their owners soon. If your child has lost something please ask them to carefully check the Breezeway or lost property area, as it may be there waiting for them.

Safe Play

This term our positive education focus is on building positive relationships and this includes positive relationships with ourselves in regard to playing safely when on the playground. All classes have spent a great deal of time developing class and shared essential agreements about how we can be safe when we are both inside and outside of the classroom. Unfortunately, there has been some unsafe behaviour by those who have forgotten one of the most important parts of staying safe while playing, '*Hands and feet to ourselves*'. We cannot have a breach of this agreement as it always ends in others feeling unsafe and harmed.

Another way to stay safe is to always be in the right area for play. Some students are finding it challenging to remain with their cohorts and need constant reminders to be in the correct place so that there will always be

teachers who know them on duty to keep everyone safe. Please have a conversation with your child about these two important ways to play safely. Teachers are offering gold tokens to students who are modelling safe play, which goes towards helping each house earn house points.

Morning drop offs

Another way to keep everyone safe is by making sure that your children, whether coming by foot, bike, skateboard or car, are not dropped off at school before 8:50 am, unless they are going to before school care, as there are no teachers on duty to help before this time.

If you would like to nominate your child (aged 10-12 years) for the 200m IM and 200m Freestyle events please email Heidi Norton (Heidi.quibell@ed.act.edu.au) by Tuesday, 19th March 2024. Nominated swimmers must have achieved the qualifying time in order to swim at the ACT Swimming Championships and these times must be verified by a Swim Club.
